SYNOPSIS: Craniofacial pain is a complex and multifactorial condition that can be challenging to manage. This workshop is designed to provide participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to assess and manage patients with complex craniofacial pain presentations.

SESSION ONE: Assessment and Management of the Complex Patient with maxillofacial dysfunction and pain and Collaboration with Other Disciplines

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Understand the multidisciplinary approach to the assessment and management of the complex craniofacial pain patient.
- Identify the key components of a comprehensive craniofacial pain assessment, including history, examination, and imaging.
- Expand knowledge of the clinical (differential) examination and management of the patients with craniofacial pain who has a complex problem.
- Understand the importance of collaboration with other disciplines in the management of the craniofacial pain patient.

PART TWO: Clinical Classification of Craniofacial Neuropathies and its Clinical Implementation

Discussion of a complicated case of craniofacial neuropathy illustrates how musculoskeletal therapy can make a positive contribution to the quality of life of this persistent pain group.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Understand the clinical classification of craniofacial neuropathy.
- Identify the main characteristics of the different types of craniofacial neuropathies.
- · Discuss management options for patients with complex facial neuropathies

This workshop will be highly interactive with a combination of didactic sessions, case presentations, and small group discussions. Participants will have the opportunity to learn from experts in the field of craniofacial pain and neuropathy and to share their own experiences and challenges.

By the end of the workshop, participants will have a deeper understanding of musculoskeletal assessment and management of complex craniofacial pain presentations and the importance of collaboration with other disciplines.

Based on participant feedback from last year, the afternoon will be solely dedicated to demonstrations of the specific injection techniques and hands on participation utilizing skulls and mannequins. COURSE OUTLINE:

Beyond the diagnostic dilemmas we face when introduced to a patient with persistent orofacial pain, we then have the difficult task of choosing therapeutic directions of care that are most likely to ease suffering and promote tissue healing. From this perspective, injection protocol are amongst the tools that have proven to be beneficial in assisting diagnosis and addressing tissue injury/sensitization in somatic and neural structures.

As the pain disorders that are encountered by orofacial pain practitioners can be broadly divided into somatic, neuropathic and neuroplastic pain disorders, our challenges often lie in addressing persistent pain in muscles, tendons, the temporomandibular joints and painful conditions directly involving the trigeminal and occipital nerves. In

addition, the neurovascular pain disorders inclusive of migraines, must also be kept in mind when a working diagnosis is being established and treatment is being planned.

This full day program therefore will be designed to discuss and demonstrate the use of both diagnostic and therapeutic injections. The anatomy and neuroanatomy of the orofacial region will be reviewed along with the indications that prompt the use of these injections, specific injection technique protocol and armamentarium, injection frequency recommendations and after care. The use of ultrasound as a tool to assist injection accuracy will also be introduced for common injection protocol and for the regenerative medicine options that are emerging to address temporomandibular joint pathology.

Supportive literature will be presented where available and demonstration videos will be incorporated into the morning presentations. The afternoon will be dedicated to hands on demonstrations of the specific injection protocol with individual skull models being distributed to assist in understanding the regional anatomy.

Our overall goal is to provide both relevant and up to date didactic knowledge alongside hands-on skills

Injection techniques that will be discussed include:

- · Dry Needling
- Trigger point (myoneural) injections
- Prolo therapy (dextrose and lidocaine) for inflammatory disorders
- Hyaluronic Acid (Supartz)
- Steroid injections: Intra-articular/joint capsule, and tendon/ligament attachments
- Regenerative Injection Therapy with Stem Cells
- Botox: Migraine protocol, neuropathic pain, muscle disorders, oromandibular dystonia
- Auriculotemporal nerve blocks
- · Occipital nerve blocks,
- Sphenopalatine ganglion nerve blocks
- Techniques used to address the acute TM joint lock
- · Ultrasound guided injections

SYNOPSIS: During the last decade, patients with chronic pain have increasingly turned to cannabis as a strategy to reduce pain. Many patients with chronic pain also report using cannabis to alleviate other problems that frequently accompany chronic pain, such as sleep disturbances and psychological distress. At the end of this presentation, participants should be able to identify some of the most common types of cannabis products used by patients with chronic pain. Participants should also be able to describe the potential benefits associated with cannabis use that have been observed among patients with chronic pain. Through this presentation, participants will also learn about the potential problems that may accompany the use of cannabis among patients with chronic pain. Participants will be familiarized with the potential psychological and neurocognitive problems that may be associated with cannabis use, and with the diagnostic criteria for cannabis use disorder. Finally, participants should be able to discuss current gaps in knowledge regarding the potential benefits and problems associated with cannabis in the context of chronic pain management.

Accurate Classification and Treatment Outcomes- Getting to know ICOP

SYNOPSIS: The International Classification of Orofacial Pain, also known as ICOP, is a valuable tool for clinicians in diagnosing and treating orofacial pain. It provides a comprehensive and systematic approach to understanding the underlying causes of orofacial pain, which can often be complex and difficult to diagnose.

The purpose of ICOP is to standardize the classification and diagnosis of orofacial pain, enabling healthcare professionals to make accurate diagnoses and develop effective treatment plans. It is particularly useful in cases where the diagnosis is uncertain, or where the clinician is unaware of the specific clinical presentation.

ICOP is based on a series of interrelated axes, including the location of the pain, the type of pain, its duration and pattern, and any associated symptoms or conditions. These axes provide a detailed framework for diagnosis, allowing clinicians to identify the underlying causes of orofacial pain and develop tailored treatment plans.

One of the primary benefits of ICOP is its ability to improve treatment outcomes. By accurately identifying the underlying causes of orofacial pain, clinicians can develop targeted treatment plans that address the root cause of the problem. This can lead to more effective and efficient treatments, reducing the need for repeated or unnecessary interventions.

Additionally, by standardizing the classification and diagnosis of orofacial pain, ICOP can help to improve communication between healthcare professionals, ensuring that patients receive consistent and high-quality care. It can also be used as a tool for research, providing a consistent and reliable framework for studying orofacial pain.

In conclusion, the International Classification of Orofacial Pain is a valuable resource for clinicians in diagnosing and treating orofacial pain. Its systematic approach enables healthcare professionals to accurately identify the underlying causes of pain and develop targeted treatment plans, leading to more effective and efficient care.

Thve First Multidimensional Evaluation System for Bruxism: the STAB

Daniele Manfredini, DDS, MSc, PhD

SYNOPSIS: The definition of bruxism has evolved over the past few years, progressively going beyond the old belief that bruxism is synonymous of grinding the teeth while asleep (Lobbezoo et al., 2013; Lobbezoo et al., 2018). With the increase in knowledge concerning the sleep correlates and the muscle activities that may equally be present also during wakefulness(Manfredini et al., 2019; Manfredini et al., 2021), the bruxism construct has shifted from a pathology or disorder to a motor activity that may be a sign of underlying conditions and may even have possible physiological or protective relevance (Raphael et al., 2016; Manfredini et al., 2016).

In the 2018 consensus paper, sleep bruxism (SB) is defined as a masticatory muscle activity (MMA) during sleep that is characterized as rhythmic (phasic) or non-rhythmic (tonic) and is not a movement disorder or a sleep disorder in otherwise healthy individuals. Awake bruxism (AB) is defined as a masticatory muscle activity during wakefulness that is characterized by repetitive or sustained tooth contact and/or by bracing or trusting of the mandible and is not a movement disorder in otherwise healthy individuals (Lobbezoo et al., 2018).

Within these premises, while preparing the Standardized Tool for the Assessment of Bruxism (STAB), the need emerged for the identification of the best strategy to define the bruxism status, comorbidities, etiology, and consequences. As muscle activities, both sleep and awake bruxism require a thorough assessment that could be based on a combination of subject-based, clinically based, and instrumentally based information.

The rationale for creating the tool and the road map that led to the selection of items included in the STAB have been discussed in some recent publications (Manfredini et al., 2020; Manfredini et al., 2022). This lecture presents the STAB, with the list of items included in each specific axis and domain.
